

Did you know that approximately 30% of your household garbage is food waste that could be composted instead of landfilled?

The TNRD offers a variety of options for residents to divert organic waste so it doesn't reach our landfills. All TNRD composters are subsidized to make them affordable for residents.

1. Backyard Composter:

This system breaks down yard and garden waste plus household kitchen scraps including fruit/veggies, coffee/tea grounds and filters, egg shells, paper, and grains. Keep meat, bones, dairy, greasy/oily foods and pet waste out.

2. Worm Composter:

Worm composter systems are great for people living in apartments or in areas with bear activity since it can be done indoors. Red wiggler worms eat your kitchen scraps including fruit and veggie scraps, coffee grounds/filters, paper, and egg shells. Keep meat, bones, dairy, citrus, greasy/oily foods out.

3. Green Cone Food Digester:

This system digests waste put into it and no finished compost is removed from the unit. Great for folks who want to divert their organic waste but do not want to harvest finished soil. It can also handle meat, bones, dairy products and pet waste. No yard or garden waste should go into it. It is also effective in areas with bear activity as they have a difficult time getting into the cone.

What's wrong with putting it in my garbage?

1. Landfilled organic waste - especially food waste - contributes directly to climate change as the methane gas generated by rotting organics in landfills is a greenhouse gas 21 times more potent than CO₂ (vehicle exhaust).

2. The moisture content of organics contributes greatly to the creation of leachate, a management problem for landfills and a threat to ground and surface water quality.

3. Finished compost is a rich, natural fertilizer that returns valuable nutrients back into the soil promoting the growth of healthy plants.

4. It costs you money! Organic waste is heavy due to its moisture content. Composting will reduce your waste by up to 30%, thus reducing your tipping fees by the same amount.
