CONSOLIDATED SOLID WASTE FACILITIES BYLAW NO. 2681

A bylaw to regulate and set fees for the use of Thompson-Nicola Regional District municipal solid waste disposal and recycling facilities

WHEREAS the Thompson-Nicola Regional District may make bylaws to establish the service for the regulation, storage and management of solid waste and recyclable material, including the regulation of facilities and commercial vehicles used in relation to these matters;

AND WHEREAS the Thompson-Nicola Regional District has, by Solid Waste Management Local Service Establishment Bylaw No. 1500, established the service of Solid Waste Management;

AND WHEREAS the Thompson-Nicola Regional District may, by bylaw, impose fees and charges payable in respect of all or part of a service of the regional district;

AND WHEREAS the Thompson-Nicola Regional District has an approved Regional Solid Waste Management Plan;

AND WHEREAS the Thompson-Nicola Regional District desires to establish fees and set standards for and regulate and manage the use of recycling and disposal facilities managed by the Thompson-Nicola Regional District and operated according to the approved Regional Solid Waste Management Plan;

NOW THEREFORE the Board of Directors of the Thompson-Nicola Regional District, in open meeting assembled, enact as follows:

1. **CITATION**

This bylaw may be cited as “Solid Waste Management Facilities Bylaw No. 2681.

2. **DEFINITIONS, INTERPRETATION AND SCHEDULES**

In this bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires:

Asbestos Containing Material means specific materials that have been tested and confirmed by a qualified professional to contain asbestos, or any material as defined in Section 6 of the BC Workers Compensation Act – Occupational Health and Safety Regulation. See **Controlled Waste** and **SCHEDULE “F”**.

Auto Hulk means a vehicle that is no longer used for transportation purposes and/or is not registered. Does not include autoparts that are free of liquid. See **Prohibited Waste**.

Bag means a container holding a volume up to 66cm x 91 cm or 77 litres equivalent.

Biomedical Waste means waste defined as such in the *Hazardous Waste Regulation* (BC Reg. 63/1988), and in the document “*Guidelines for the Management of Biomedical Waste in Canada*” (ICCME, Feb. 1992). See **Prohibited Waste**.

Biosolids means stabilized, dewatered treatment plant sludge resulting from the treatment of liquid waste. See **Controlled Waste**.

Board means the Board of Directors of the Thompson-Nicola Regional District.

Bulky Waste means items with a volume greater than 2 cubic meters or 70 cubic feet equivalent or items with a length greater than 3 meters or 9.8 feet equivalent, including, but not limited to: hot tubs, recreational vehicles, pre-fabricated homes, trailers, watercraft, and other articles that the **Director** or designate determines require special handling and disposal techniques. See **Controlled Waste**.

Burned Material means materials damaged by fire, heat, electricity or a caustic agent that have been allowed to entirely cool in a manner acceptable to the **Director** or designate. See **Controlled Waste**. **Burned Materials** that are hot or smouldering are a **Prohibited Waste**. See **Prohibited Waste**.

Bullying/Harassment means any inappropriate conduct or comment by a person towards a worker that the person knew or reasonably ought to have known would cause that worker to be humiliated or intimidated, as per the *Workers Compensation Act*. Bullying and harassing behaviour can include: verbal, written, digital or printed aggression, insults or threats, humiliating initiation practices or hazing, spreading malicious rumours, calling someone derogatory names, vandalizing personal belongings, and isolation and/or exclusion from work-related activities.

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Clean Fill – Commercial means inorganic and organic **Clean Soil**, containing only small sized rocks and pieces of concrete, asphalt or brick, such that the material is suitable for landfill cover material delivered by a **Commercial Hauler**, and provided that the material does not include: wood, plastic or pieces of rebar. See **Controlled Waste**.

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Clean Fill – Residential means inorganic and organic **Clean Soil**, containing only small sized rocks and pieces of concrete, asphalt or brick, such that the material is suitable for landfill cover material delivered by a **Residential Hauler**, and provided that the material does not include: wood, plastic or pieces of rebar. See **Controlled Waste**.

Clean Soil means soil or sediment material containing substances in quantities or concentrations less than those specified in Section 42 of the *Contaminated Sites Regulation* (BC Reg. 97/2011) of the *Environmental Management Act*.

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Commercial Hauler means a **Person** engaged in the collection, transporting, or disposing of waste materials for profit.

Condemned Foods means any food or other edible matter that has been deemed to be unfit for human consumption pursuant to the *Food Safety Act* and that does not contain **Free Liquids**. See **Controlled Waste**.

Contamination or **Contaminated** means, the presence of another material in source separated waste.

Contaminated Soil means soil or sediment or fill material containing substances in quantities or concentrations greater than those specified in Section 42 of the *Contaminated Sites Regulation* (BC Reg. 132/2011), but which is not a hazardous waste under the *Hazardous Waste Regulation* (BC Reg. 63/2009) under the *Environmental Management Act*. See **Controlled Waste**.

Controlled Waste means materials that are listed in SCHEDULE "B" attached hereto, which because of their inherent nature and quantity may require special handling and storage techniques to avoid creating health hazards, nuisances, environmental or operational issues. **Controlled Waste** may be subject to additional rules, fees and are accepted at the discretion of the **Director** or designate.

Creosote Treated Wood means wood that has been preserved by a pressure treatment with an anti-microbial pesticide product containing creosote, which may include, but is not limited to: railway ties, telephone poles, and dock pilings. See **Controlled Waste**.

Decision means a decision made by a **Person** exercising their authority as granted to them pursuant to this Bylaw.

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Demolition, Renovation and Construction Waste or DRC Waste means waste that originates from any site where a human-made structure is totally or partially disassembled. It includes but is not limited to wood, roofing, concrete, asphalt, glass, insulation, flooring, floor covering, masonry, metal or plastic siding, gypsum or plaster wallboard and material or devices (such as cabinetry, electrical or plumbing fixtures) which are normally permanently affixed to the building. Also includes waste that originates from sites where a human-made structure is being erected. Does not include furniture that is not intended to be affixed to the building such as couches, chairs, tables, desks (these items may be disposed of as **Refuse** or **Wood Waste** depending on material type. See **Controlled Waste**

Director means the Director of Environmental Services of the **Regional District** or designate.

Disposal means the placement of **Municipal Solid Waste** into a **Landfill** or **Facility** for eventual transport to a **Landfill**.

Dusty Material means material that can become airborne when being deposited or managed at a **Facility** and which may subsequently pose a health risk or impair visibility, including, but not limited to: sawdust, foundry dust, ash and soot. See **Controlled Waste**.

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Eco-Card means a card issued by the **Regional District** to pay **User Fees** at **Facilities**.

Excluded Ozone-Depleting Substances (ODS)-Containing Products means ODS-containing products that are excluded from the Major Appliances Recycling Roundtable (MARR) stewardship plan, including but not limited to water cooler/dispensers, large central air conditioner units, commercial or industrial cooler and refrigerated display units. See **Controlled Waste**.

Facility means a **Landfill**, eco-depot, transfer station, materials recovery facility or composting facility leased, owned and/or operated by the **Regional District** and used for receiving or processing **Municipal Solid Waste** or recyclable material.

Free Liquid means any portion of material that passes through and drops from a paint filter using the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Method 9095B Paint Filter Liquids Test, within a 5 minute test period (Hazardous Waste Test Methods SW-846, 9095B/1994). See **Prohibited Waste**.

Hazardous Waste means any material defined as such in the *Hazardous Waste Regulation* (BC Reg. 63/1988), which includes, but is not limited to: toxins, poisons, corrosives, irritants, strong sensitizers, flammables, and ignitables. See **Prohibited Waste**.

Industrial, Commercial & Institutional or **IC&I** means sources of **Municipal Solid Waste** and/or recycling that includes office buildings, retail and wholesale establishments, restaurants, schools, colleges, libraries, hospitals, prisons etc. **IC&I** can also include residential material being hauled to a **Facility** by a private business/collector.

Industrial, Commercial, and Institutional Recycling or **IC&I Recycling** means paper fibre, containers, foam – white, foam - coloured, other flexible plastic packaging, glass and source separated corrugated cardboard that originates from **IC&I** establishments or activities. Additional categories may be added as service and markets become available.

Industrial Waste means solid waste materials discarded from manufacturing, processing or production of goods and products, including, but not limited to: waste generated from industrial operations such as forestry, pulp and paper, mining, fisheries, and food processing. See **Controlled Waste**.

Infested Vegetation means trees, shrubs, herbaceous plants or associated fruit that show the presence of plant disease, noxious insects, pathogens or related pests that have caused or are likely to spread the infestation or cause significant damage to trees, shrubs, herbaceous plants or associated fruit. See **Controlled Waste**.

Land Clearing Debris means any tree stumps, root mats, branches, brush, logs, vegetation, or other woody debris, generated from land clearing activity that is greater than 20.32 cm or 8 inches equivalent in diameter. Also includes rocks and soil from land clearing activities. See **Controlled Waste**.

Landfill means a location for final disposal of **Municipal Solid Waste** on land regulated by the MOE & CCS where **Municipal Solid Waste** is spread and compacted; cover soil or alternate cover is applied daily, so that effects on the environment (including public health and safety) are minimized.

Large Dead Animals and Dead Stock means any dead stock, deceased animal or part thereof, weighing more than 60 kilograms or 132 pounds equivalent which is not **Specified Risk Material**. See **Controlled Waste**.

Load means **Municipal Solid Waste** which arrives at a **Facility** in a **Vehicle**.

Major Appliances means all products listed under the MARR list of products.

Manager means the Manager of Environmental Health Services of the **Regional District** or designate.

Mattress means a unit comprised of a case of canvas or other heavy textile stuffed with wool, cotton, other fibres or similar material, with or without coiled springs, that was used as a bed or as a support for a bed (boxspring), Includes foam mattresses used as a primary sleeping surface. Excluded items include but are not limited to foam mattress toppers, crib mattresses, and camping foamies.

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Mattress – Commercial means a **Mattress** originating from a business/organization in which the **Mattress** was used as part of the business/organization operations, OR a **Mattress** delivered by a **Commercial Hauler**.

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Mattress – Residential means a **Mattress** originating from a residential property AND is delivered by a **Residential Hauler**.

Metal Drums and Tanks means any empty metal container with a non-removable top, including, but not limited to: drums to contain fuel and underground oil tanks, but not including: metal tanks used to hold compressed gases, such as **Propane Tanks**. See **Controlled Waste**.

Municipal Solid Waste means waste from residential, commercial, institutional, demolition/renovation, land clearing or construction sources and may include waste materials specified by the MOE & CCS to be included in a waste management plan.

Non-ODS Containing Products means **Major Appliances** that do not contain **ODS**, including clothes washers, clothes dryers, ranges, range hoods and downdrafts, built-in ovens, built-in and over the range microwave ovens, surface cooking units, dishwashers, food waste disposers, trash compactors, built-in electric water dispensers.

Noxious Weeds means all weeds designated within the Provincial and Regional Noxious Weed lists of the *Weed Control Regulation* (BC Reg. 4/2010) and weeds that are classified as noxious by the **Regional District**. See **Controlled Waste**.

Ozone Depleting Substance or **ODS** means Ozone Depleting Halocarbon refrigerants subject to the *Ozone Depleting Substances and Other Halocarbons Regulation* (BC Reg. 317/2010) from residential products that utilize a vapor-compression refrigeration system listed in the provincial steward, MARR's Product List and Definitions listed on MARR's website.

ODS-Containing Products means **Major Appliances** containing a compressor and **ODS**, including refrigerators, wine coolers/beverage centres, freezers, room air conditioners, portable air conditioners and humidifiers.

Officer means any member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, City Police, a Conservation Officer, a Regional District Bylaw Enforcement Officer or other **Regional District Personnel** or designate appointed from time to time by the **Director** to administer and enforce this Bylaw.

Out of Region Waste means **Municipal Solid Waste** that originates outside the administrative boundaries of the **Regional District**. See **Controlled Waste**.

Polychlorinated Biphenyls or **PCBs** means any chlorobiphenyls that have the molecular formula $C_{12}H_{(10-n)}Cl_n$ in which “n” is greater than 2 (Schedule 1 in the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act/1999*). The maximum allowable concentration for equipment that is designed to use PCBs is defined as 50ppm. Sources of PCBs include fluorescent light ballasts, small motor capacitors, transformers and high intensity discharge light ballasts. See **Prohibited Waste**.

Person means an individual, a body corporate, a firm partnership, association or any other legal entity or an employee or agent thereof.

Provincial Product Stewardship Program Material means items and provisions that are included in an approved Provincial Stewardship Program as identified in the *Recycling Regulation*, such as alarms, beverage containers, electronics, cell phones, lead-acid batteries, lights, major appliances, outdoor power equipment, small electrical appliances, packaging and printed paper, paints, refundable beverage containers, solvents, pesticides, gasoline, pharmaceuticals, thermostats, tires, used oil and antifreeze. Additional stewardship programs may be added as the MOE & CCS introduces them.

Prohibited Waste means gaseous, liquid or **Municipal Solid Waste** not acceptable for burial or **Disposal** or recycling at a **Facility** as identified in SCHEDULE “C” attached hereto. **Prohibited Waste** may not enter a **Facility** in any capacity.

Radioactive Waste means waste containing a prescribed substance as defined in the *Atomic Energy Control Act (Canada)* in sufficient quantity or concentration to require a licence for possession or use under that Act and regulations made under that Act. See **Prohibited Waste**.

Refuse means mixed categories of waste that originates from residential, **IC&I** sources, other than **Demolition, Renovation and Construction Waste**, suitable for **Disposal** at a **Facility** but does not include **Prohibited Waste**.

Regional District means the Thompson-Nicola Regional District.

Regional District Personnel means an employee of the **Regional District**.

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Residential Hauler means a **Person** engaged in the collection, transporting, or disposing of waste materials from residential sources for no profit.

Scrap Metal means material which contains ferrous and/or non-ferrous metals, including, but not limited to: sheet metal, siding, roofing, rebar, flashings, pipes, window frames, doors, furnaces, duct work, drums with removable tops, empty tanks, wire, cable, bathtubs, fencing, bicycle frames, automotive body parts free of liquid, machinery, garbage cans, metal furniture, tire rims, small engines free of liquids, appliances and fixtures, but does not include: **ODS-Containing Products** (unless properly certified as having refrigerants professionally removed).

Site Operator means that person employed by or having a contract or agreement with the **Regional District** for caretaker or attendant duties at a **Facility**.

Small Dead Animals means any deceased animal or portions thereof, weighing less than 60 kilograms or 132 pounds equivalent. See **Controlled Waste**.

Specified Risk Material or **SRM** means the skull, brain, trigeminal ganglia (nerves attached to brain), eyes, tonsils, spinal cord and dorsal root ganglia (nerves attached to the spinal cord) of cattle aged 30 months or older, the distal ileum (portion of the small intestine) of cattle of all ages, and cattle deadstock. See **Prohibited Waste**.

Unsecured Load means the condition of a **Load** on a **Vehicle** such that there is the potential for materials to leak, spill, blow out, fall, or otherwise be dislodged from a vehicle and/or trailer attached to a vehicle entering and exiting a **Facility** and, for an open truck box or trailer, including if a cover such as a tarpaulin and/or other overlay is not used to cover a **Load**.

User Fee(s) means the user fees as set out and itemized in SCHEDULE "A" attached hereto.

Valid Identification means government issued photo identification including a valid British Columbia Identification Card, Canadian drivers license, International drivers license, passport, or citizenship papers or immigration documents.

Vehicle means a vehicle, as defined by British Columbia's *Motor Vehicle Act* (RSBC/1996 Chapter 318).

Visitor means a **Person** who arrives at a **Facility** for purposes other than to deposit **Municipal Solid Waste** or recyclable material.

Wood Waste means organic wood material classified as either **Wood Waste - Clean** or **Wood Waste - Contaminated**.

Wood Waste - Clean means clean, organic wood material including, but not limited to kiln dried dimensional lumber, wood pallets, oriented strand board, wood panel products, medium density panel board, forming wood without residual concrete or aggregate. Clean wood must be free of preservatives, heavy coats of paint, wire, fiberglass, asphalt roofing material, fasteners, glue, coverings, or chemical treatment and other non-wood materials. Nails and screws are acceptable.

Wood Waste – Contaminated means organic wood treated with preservatives such as chromated copper arsenate (CAA), aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and ammonium copper arsenate (ACA) to prevent rotting. Also includes wood with heavy coats of paint or other surface treatments. Does not include creosote treated wood, plastic laminated material, vinyl surface covered material or fibre-cement siding.

Yard Waste - Residential means organic materials originating from yard and garden management, maintenance or repair at residential properties delivered to a **Facility** by the occupier or owner of a residential property including but not limited to: grass, lawn and hedge clippings, flowers, weeds, pine needles, pine cones, leaves, shrubs, and shrub and tree branches (less than 20.32 centimeters or 8 inches equivalent in diameter), but does not include: tree stumps, branches greater than 20.32 centimeters or 8 inches equivalent in diameter, **Noxious Weeds**, **Infested Vegetation**, rocks, sand, soil, sod, or fruit or vegetable material.

Yard Waste - Commercial means organic material originating from yard and garden management, maintenance or repair at residential, commercial, institutional or industrial properties delivered to a **Facility** by a landscape contractor or business, including but not limited to grass, lawn and hedge clippings, flowers, weeds, pine needles, pine cones, leaves, shrubs, and shrub and tree branches (less than 20.32 centimeters or 8 inches equivalent in diameter) and material which originates from residential horticulture activities, but does not include: tree stumps, branches greater than 20.32 centimeters or 8 inches equivalent in diameter, **Noxious Weeds, Infested Vegetation**, rocks, sand, soil, sod, or fruit or vegetable material.

- 2.1 Words or phrases defined in the *British Columbia Interpretation Act, Community Charter, or Local Government Act* or any successor legislation shall have the same meaning when used in this Bylaw, unless otherwise defined in this Bylaw. Unless otherwise stated, and notwithstanding the case used (upper case or lower case), when words or phrases that are defined in this section 2 of this Bylaw are used in the body or schedules of this Bylaw, they have the meaning ascribed to them as set out in section 2.
- 2.2 The headings contained in this Bylaw are for convenience only and are not to be construed as defining, or in any way limiting the scope or the intent of the provisions of this Bylaw.
- 2.3 If a division, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Bylaw is for any reason held to be invalid by the decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall be severed and such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw.
- 2.4 Any act or enactment referred to herein is a reference to an enactment of the Province of British Columbia and regulations thereto, as amended, revised, consolidated or replaced from time to time, and any bylaw referred to herein (as may be cited by short title or otherwise) is a reference to an enactment of the Regional District, as amended, revised, consolidated or replaced from time to time.
- 2.5 The following schedules are hereby made and declared to be integral parts of this Bylaw are attached to and form part of this Bylaw and are enforceable in the same manner as this Bylaw:

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3. REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS OF USE

- 3.1 The **Regional District** hereby authorizes **Site Operators, Regional District Personnel** or **Officers** to enforce such rules governing the use of a **Facility** and/or provide directions to users of the **Facility** which are consistent with this Bylaw and which are necessary or convenient for the efficient and lawful operation of the **Facility**.
- 3.2 Every **Person** depositing **Municipal Solid Waste** at a **Facility** shall comply with and abide by:
- the terms and conditions of this Bylaw; and
 - all rules and directions of the **Site Operator, Regional District Personnel**, or **Officer** whether such rules or directions are in the form of signage, written or verbal

instructions, including, but not limited to the Regulations and Conditions of Use set out in Section 3.

- 3.3 The **Regional District** hereby establishes and imposes the **User Fees** set out in SCHEDULE "A" attached hereto.
- 3.4 Every **Person** depositing **Municipal Solid Waste** at a **Facility** shall pay the applicable **User Fees** to the **Regional District**.
- 3.5 The **Board** or **Director** may designate days or times during which **User Fees** shall not be payable under this Bylaw.
- 3.6 In the event a weigh scale is not present or not operational, the **Site Operator** shall charge **User Fees** in accordance with the volume based rates set out in SCHEDULE "A" attached hereto.
- 3.7 **User Fees** are payable to the **Regional District** by:
- (a) **Eco-Card** or customer account at **Facilities** without a point-of-sale machine.
 - (b) Debit card, credit card (Visa/Master Card), **Eco-Card** or customer account at **Facilities** with a point-of-sale machine.
 - (c) In the event the point-of-sale machine is temporarily out of order, payment can be made with an **Eco-Card** or credit card imprint. The credit card imprint charge will be processed when the point-of-sale machine is functional.
- 3.8 Customer accounts may only be used in accordance with the provisions of SCHEDULE "D" attached hereto.
- 3.9 No **Person** shall deposit **Prohibited Waste** at a **Facility**.
- 3.10 No **Person** shall **Bully/Harass** any Customer, **Visitor**, **Site Operator**, **Regional District Personnel**, or **Officer**. A **Site Operator**, **Regional District Personnel**, or **Officer** may order any person deemed to be **Bullying/Harassing** to leave the **Facility** and/or be banished from use of **Facilities** at the discretion of the **Director** or designate.
- Bylaw. 2731 3.11 No **Person** shall deposit **Controlled Waste** at a **Facility** except in accordance with the **Facility** restrictions/requirements and the specifications set out in SCHEDULE "B" and SCHEDULE "F" attached hereto. In addition to specifications set out in SCHEDULE "B" and SCHEDULE "F" the **Director** or designate may control the quantity of materials accepted at sites depending on available bin or storage capacity. At the discretion of the **Director** or designate, additional disposal fees may be applied to any load of **Controlled Waste** when the type, quantity, condition, size, origin, or disposal location create an additional cost to the regional district to accept, handle, transport, or dispose of the **Controlled Waste**.
- 3.12 **Site Operators** and/or **Regional District Personnel** have the authority to determine the location where **Municipal Solid Waste** brought into a **Facility** is to be placed. This includes bins, cribs, collection areas and **Landfills**. **Loads** may be rejected based on assessment if there is no available capacity in collection areas.

- 3.13 **Site Operators** and/or **Regional District Personnel** have the authority to control certain waste types and the quality of such waste types that is allowable at **Facilities** with varying bin and collection area capacity.
- 3.14 No **Person** shall enter a **Facility** while it is closed without prior consent from the **Regional District**.
- 3.15 No **Person** shall cause contamination of stockpiles of waste materials or recycling material.
- 3.16 No **Person** shall operate a **Vehicle** in a **Facility** exceeding the posted speed limit or in a manner deemed to be dangerous or damaging by a **Site Operator, Regional District Personnel, or Officer**. Operating a **Vehicle** in a dangerous manner may include, but is not limited to: driving too close to equipment or personnel. Operating a **Vehicle** in a damaging manner may include accelerating onto the weigh scale and applying brakes forcefully, or accelerating quickly from a stopped position on the scale causing excess motion to the scale deck.
- 3.17 No **Person** shall operate a **Vehicle** in a **Facility** with an **Unsecured Load**.
- 3.18 Any **Person** entering a **Facility** must, upon request, produce **Valid Identification**.
- 3.19 In the event of a discrepancy in the interpretation of these **Site Regulations** and this Bylaw between a **Person** depositing **Municipal Solid Waste** at a **Facility** and the **Site Operator**, the **Site Operator** shall have the authority to make the final **Decision**.
- 3.20 All material deposited at a **Facility** becomes the property of the **Regional District**. No **Person** shall remove or salvage any material deposited at a **Facility**
- 3.21 No **Person** shall light, smoke or vape any cigarette, cigar, or pipe within the boundaries of a **Facility**.
- 3.22 No **Visitor** shall enter a **Facility** without first checking-in at the **Facility** office with the **Site Operator**.
- 3.23 No **Person** shall ignite a fire or cause a fire to be ignited at any **Facility** or bring any burning materials or hot ashes to a **Facility**.
- 3.24 No **Person** shall discharge any firearm at a **Facility**, except as permitted under an applicable enactment and prearranged by the **Director**, for example, as may be necessary to control wildlife.
- 3.25 Children under the age of 13 years or pets are not permitted at **Facilities**, except when they remain within the confines of a **Vehicle**. Children under the age of 13 years are permitted in the Recycle BC area under the direct supervision of an adult.
- 3.26 Without written approval of the **Director**, no **Person** shall remain at a **Facility** longer than is required to deposit **Municipal Solid Waste** or conduct other business related to **Facility** operation.
- 3.28 Any **Person** who violates any of the provisions of this Bylaw or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any of the provisions of this bylaw, or who neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any provision of bylaw commits an offence against this bylaw and is subject to:

- (a) a fine in accordance with the TNRD *Notice Enforcement Bylaw* if an information respecting the violation is laid by means of a ticket;
 - (b) upon summary conviction, a fine not exceeding \$10,000 and the costs of prosecution or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both;
 - (c) a penalty in accordance with the *Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act* and the Regional District *Notice Enforcement Bylaw* if a bylaw notice is issued respecting the violation; or
 - (d) any combination of the above.
- 3.29 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Bylaw, any **Person** who contravenes this Bylaw and causes damage to a **Facility** shall be responsible to pay all costs associated with remediation of the **Facility**.
- 3.30 A separate offence shall be deemed to be committed upon each event or day during and in which a contravention occurs or continues.


4 **INSPECTIONS**


- 4.1 An **Officer, Site Operator** or **Regional District Personnel** may inspect any **Load** entering a **Facility** for the purposes of determining:
- (a) compliance with this Bylaw; or
 - (b) the nature of the contents of the waste contained in the load for the purpose of a waste audit.

SCHEDULE "D"**CUSTOMER ACCOUNTS POLICY**

1. Organizations that incur **User Fees** in excess of \$50 per month or per **Load** may apply to the **Regional District** for a credit account by completing a Regional District Application for Tipping Account form.
2. Exemptions from the requirement in item 1. above will be limited to:
 - (a) Province of British Columbia, departments or agencies clearly identified;
 - (b) Government of Canada, departments or agencies clearly identified;
 - (c) Other Municipalities, Towns, Villages, and Districts, and First Nations Bands.
3. Completed Application forms will be forwarded to the **Regional District** Finance Department for processing and approval.
4. Customer invoices will be generated monthly, and will be payable within 30 days of the invoice date.
5. Customers with accounts in arrears after 30 days will be subject to a service charge at the rate equal to the prime rate of interest posted by the Royal Bank of Canada, plus three percent (3%) annually.
6. Customers with accounts in arrears after 45 days will be contacted requesting payment within 15 days. Customers who fail to remit payment within 60 days will be contacted and advised that they will not be permitted to dispose **Municipal Solid Waste** or recyclable material at any **Regional District Facility** pending payment in arrears.
7. If the account holder fails to pay the **Regional District** all fees owing in full within 60 days of the invoice date, the **Regional District** may withhold monies equivalent to those charges, plus interest, from the account holder under a separate contract, agreement or offer between the **Regional District** and the account holder. Failure to pay after 60 days will result in cancellation of disposal privileges.
8. Upon full payment of the outstanding balance, including service charges, disposal privileges will be reinstated on a Cash On Demand (COD) basis.
9. Credit privileges may be reinstated to a customer charge account that is on COD basis after a three month period without incident, at the discretion of the **Director** or designate.
10. Customer accounts falling 60 days past due a second time will be placed on COD for a period of three years, once the outstanding balance has been paid in full. After three years, the credit account will be reconsidered at the discretion of the **Director** or designate.
11. At the discretion of the **Director** or designate, accounts that are 180 days in arrears will be sent to external collection agencies.

SCHEDULE “E”

UNABLE OR REFUSES TO PAY

1. If a **Person** using a **Facility** is unable to pay the applicable **User Fee(s)** to the **Regional District** they may return to the **Facility** within ten days to pay their outstanding **User Fee(s)**.
2. Failure to return to a **Facility** within 10 working days to pay outstanding **User Fee(s)** will result in **Regional District** issuing an invoice for the outstanding **User Fee(s)**.
3. Invoices will be in the amount of the outstanding **User Fee(s)** plus an administration fee of \$20 per invoice.
4. Invoices are payable within thirty days (30) of the invoice date.
5. Failure to pay the invoice within thirty (30) days will be considered a refusal to pay and subject to the penalty as set out in the **Regional District’s Notice Enforcement Bylaw**.
6. Failure to pay the invoice within thirty (30) days will result in a service charge equal to the prime rate of interest posted by the Royal Bank of Canada, plus three percent (3%) annually.
7. Any **Person** with unpaid invoices after forty five (45) days will be contacted requesting payment within fifteen (15) days. A **Person** who fails to remit payment within sixty (60) days will be contacted and advised that they will not be permitted to **Dispose Municipal Solid Waste** or recyclable material at any **Regional District Facility** pending payment in arrears.
8. Failure to pay within 180 days will result in amount owing being sent to an external collection agency.

SCHEDULE “F”**DISPOSAL PROCEDURE****Potential Asbestos Containing Materials (PACM)****Background**

Asbestos was widely used in B.C. as a building material until 1990 and can be present in many older buildings. Exposure to asbestos can cause serious long-term health issues and even death.

Anytime asbestos is suspected of being present in a building where renovation and/or demolition is planned, the TNRD recommends a hazard assessment first be conducted by a qualified professional. This may involve sampling and testing of specific materials to determine whether or not asbestos is present. Asbestos containing materials should only be removed and disposed of by qualified professionals.

The TNRD recognizes that some people are unaware or do not take the risks of asbestos exposure seriously. Therefore, in an effort to protect workers at TNRD disposal facilities, and the general public who use these facilities, the TNRD has adopted this procedure for accepting loads of Demolition, Renovation, and Construction (DRC) waste.

Definitions

Demolition, Renovation and Construction (DRC) Waste means waste that originates from any site where a human-made structure is totally or partially disassembled. It includes but is not limited to wood, roofing, concrete, asphalt, glass, insulation, flooring, floor covering, masonry, metal or plastic siding, gypsum or plaster wallboard and materials or devices (such as cabinetry, electrical or plumbing fixtures) which are normally permanently affixed to the building. This also includes waste that originates from sites where a human-made structure is being erected.

Potential Asbestos Containing Material (PACM) are those materials that may contain asbestos which are commonly found in commercial and residential buildings. This procedure applies to all loads containing the following Potential Asbestos Containing Materials (PACM):

- Gypsum wall board (drywall), wall tape, and drywall mud compound
- Plaster and plaster board
- Vinyl flooring and leveling compound
- Ceiling tiles
- Cement pipe
- Stucco and cement siding
- Spray applied insulation and attic insulation

A more detailed list can be found in the WorkSafeBC publications *Safe Work Practices for Handling Asbestos*, and *Asbestos Hazards in Demolition, Renovation, and Salvage*.

Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) are specific materials that have been tested and confirmed by a qualified professional to contain asbestos

Disposal of Potential Asbestos Containing Materials (PACM)

These disposal guidelines apply to all loads with PACM. For clarity, DRC loads that do not contain any PACM are not subject to these disposal guidelines and are disposed of normally in accordance to TNRD site regulations. The TNRD has identified five (5) categories of PACM:

1. New Construction
2. Post 1990 Construction
3. Pre 1990 Construction, NOT Tested for Asbestos (residents/homeowners with small quantities only)
4. Pre 1990, Tested & Confirmed to NOT Contain Asbestos
5. Asbestos Containing Material (ACM)

Category 1 - New Construction

New construction materials consisting of unfinished cuts of gypsum (also called “cut offs”) or other constructions related debris from **new** construction.

Disposal Instructions:

- Signed declaration form required
- No pre-approval required
- New construction waste is assumed to not contain asbestos due to the waste materials being leftover/cut-off of new construction materials
- Materials may be disposed of normally in accordance to TNRD site regulations
- DRC disposal fees apply - \$160/tonne

Category 2 – Post 1990 Construction

This category applies to PACM where the origin, age, and content of the material is known to have been installed after December 31, 1989. It is widely accepted that construction materials manufactured after this date do not contain asbestos.

Disposal Instructions:

- Signed declaration form required
- No pre-approval required
- Materials may be disposed of normally in accordance to TNRD site regulations
- DRC disposal fees apply - \$160/tonne

Category 3 – Pre 1990 Construction, NOT Tested for Asbestos (residents/homeowners with small quantities only)

This category applies to PACM from **residents/homeowners only** where a hazard assessment has not been completed (not tested for asbestos) and the origin, age, and content of the PACM is known to have been installed before January 1st, 1990, **OR** where the origin, age and content of the materials are unknown.

Disposal Instructions:

- Signed declaration form required
- No pre-approval required
- Materials must be double-bagged and sealed in plastic bags that are at least 6 mils thick (0.006 inches) before arriving at a disposal facility
- Loads are restricted to maximum of fifteen (15) bags per customer per week
- Accepted at TNRD Eco-Depots only (not at small transfer stations)
- Loads only accepted from residents/homeowners
- **Pre 1990 PACM from commercial/businesses will not be accepted under this category, if a commercial load originates from a building where a hazard assessment has not been completed by a qualified professional (lab results required) it will be treated as ACM (Category 5)**
- Material must be deposited in the appropriate location as directed by site attendants and in accordance with all other TNRD site regulations
- DRC disposal fees apply - \$160/tonne

Category 4 – Pre 1990 Tested & Confirmed to NOT Contain Asbestos

This category applies to disposal of PACM originating from buildings where a hazard assessment has been completed and lab results have confirmed the waste materials do **NOT** contain asbestos.

Disposal Instructions:

- Signed declaration form required
- Pre-approval required
- Hazard assessment (including lab results) and approval letter must be attached to declaration form
- Materials may be disposed of normally in accordance to TNRD site regulations
- DRC disposal fees apply - \$160/tonne

Category 5 – Asbestos Containing Material (ACM)

This category applies to disposal of ACM originating from buildings where hazard assessments have been completed by a qualified professional and the material has been tested and confirmed to be asbestos containing **OR** when PACM has not been tested and originates from buildings with a construction date prior to January 1st, 1990 (exception for small residential quantities, see Category 3)

Disposal Instructions:

- Signed declaration from required
- Pre-approval required – approval from landfill owner/operator (see below)
- 72 hours advance notice prior to disposal
- Hazard assessment (including lab results) and approval letter must be attached to declaration form (if applicable)
- Accepted at the following landfill locations only
 - Mission Flats (operated by City of Kamloops)
 - Lower Nicola (operated by TNRD)
 - Heffley Creek (operated by TNRD) – for large projects only
 - Cache Creek Landfill (operated by Belcorp Environmental Services Inc.)
- Not accepted at any Eco-Depots or transfer stations
- Materials must be double-bagged and sealed in plastic bags that are at least 6 mils thick (0.006 inches) before arriving at a disposal facility
- For large/bulk loads, other requirements may be added in accordance with the landfill owner/operator's asbestos disposal procedures
